2023 M&S FEES

Our next governing council meeting is Wednesday 2 November at 7pm, where the committee will be discussing the 2023 materials and services fees. Alternatively, you can write a letter addressed to the governing council chair or email the school prior to Monday 31 October. The proposed charge for 2023 is \$355 per student from years 7-12.

STEM SCHOLARSHIPS

The Department for Education is offering scholarships up to the value of \$10,000 in 2023 to support high school students from under represented groups. Low socioeconomical status, girls and Aboriginal learners to study the following STEM subjects at SACE stage 1 and 2 level: Chemistry, Digital Technologies, Physics, Mathematical methods and Specialist mathematics. The fund covers the cost of tutors, laptops, excursions or any other strategy that directly supports the student to achieve in their chosen STEM subjects and pathways.
