The Governing Council AGM was held this week, with our first official meeting to be held on Wednesday 26 March at 7pm. If you would like to nominate, it's not too late. At the meeting governing council approved our first Red Day for the year. It will be on Tuesday 25 March.

Last year you would have seen our exceptional SACE results with 109 students completing their SACE, 8 Aboriginal students completing their SACE, and 5 students achieving their modified SACE. 39 students received an ATAR last year, which is the strongest results college have had, with 8 achieving over 80. The college Dux was Shalini Sarkar with 99.95%. Shalini featured in The Advertiser. 46 of those received an ATAR because they studied VET. Two students received merits last year for Research Project, which is compulsory for year 11 students. It is now called Activating Futures. Factory days and intervention also negated an exceptional result. Overall the college's SACE data was very strong, with the highest B and A grades than we have had before (65%) which meant we met our Site Improvement (SIP) goals. This is an 11% increase compared to 2024.

This year we are excited to announce the SSO to Teacher Pilot Program, which acknowledges that SSO's possess the qualities and passion required to become outstanding educators themselves. The college has partnered with UniSA, to launch the program to support SSO's to train as teachers and engage in an accredited and flexible teaching degree to meet the needs of the experienced staff and of the school.


