Next week I will be on leave and Christina Nicholas will be the Acting Principal.



Community Engagement: They have actively participated in school activities and collaborated with colleagues, contributing to a positive school culture and building strong relationships with our students and staff.



Families are reminded that in line with the Department for Education mobile phone ban, Whyalla Secondary College became a phone free school in February 2023. Points to remember include:

- Year 7-10 students are to store their mobile phones and smart watches in a lockbox during the school day. They must be on silent and in flight mode.
- Year 11-12 students must keep their mobile phones and smart watches on silent and in flight mode in their bags, in their lockers. Alternatively they can store them in a lock box located in the relevant Student Services office.
- Students are not to use headphones during lesson time. Where headphones are required for curriculum and/or wellbeing purposes, a request to the teacher by the parent/caregiver can be made to allow an individual student to borrow a set of WSC headphones.
- Whilst on camp, students may take personal digital devices at their own risk; however, they must remain in a lock box throughout the entire day. The same expectations will apply during camp as at school, as outlined in the Mobile Phone Policy which can be found on our website wsc.sa.edu.au Students are permitted access to their mobiles during a designated period after dinner, providing them the opportunity to contact family before returning their phones to the lock box at lights out. Students who infringe the guidelines set out in this policy will be sent home from camp.

Students are also not permitted to post any information about camp to any form of social media (e.g. Facebook/Snapchat etc.) for the duration of camp. This is to protect the safety of students and staff while participating in the camp. Whilst away, staff have a camp phone which parents can contact should they need to reach their student in an emergency. This number is on the parent letter sent home prior to the camp commencing.
